CANTERBURY POLICY FORUM

The Policy Forum met on 12 April 2019. Key agenda items were:

- regional transport work on freight mode shift as part of the Canterbury Regional Economic Development Strategy. This included draft outcomes from a study into the cost opportunities for freight mode shift across the South Island.
- the CWMS Fit for the Future project, including receiving a copy of the interim project report previously received by the Mayoral Forum and an overview of the draft goals for 2025 and 2030
- re-visiting principles and processes for regional collaboration on advocacy and submissions on issues impacting on our region
- a report on the three regional training workshops on *Thinking together ... before we write*, and a proposal for a train-the-trainers workshop later in 2019 on writing recommendations and peer review
- a report from the Natural Hazards regional working group – the first report to the Policy Forum from this working group, which previously reported to the Operations Forum
- updates from Canterbury Planning Managers, the Climate Change working group, and the Compliance, Monitoring and Enforcement working group.
