CANTERBURY POLICY FORUM

The Canterbury Policy Forum met on 19 October 2018 and discussed:

- updates on central government's work to develop wellbeing indicators, and how they will inform advice for Budget 2019
- next steps on biodiversity work across the Canterbury region. This
 included seeking support on a programme of work to update the
 Canterbury Biodiversity Strategy and further improve collaboration
 across the region. Chief Executives and Mayors will be briefed on
 this work in coming months.
- a presentation from Keith Tallentire, Greater Christchurch Partnership, on urban development in greater Christchurch, and what lessons could be utilised elsewhere across the region.



- an update on regional training workshops that have been held across Canterbury councils.
- the CWMS Fit for the Future project, including the timeline for the project along with how councils and other stakeholder can engage to support the development of interim goals.
- updates from the Canterbury Planning Managers Group, the Climate Change working group, and the Compliance, Monitoring and Enforcement working group.
