CANTERBURY POLICY FORUM

The Policy Forum met on 5 July 2019. Key agenda items were:

- upcoming issues and proposals from central government, and how they might impact Canterbury councils
- SOLGM's community wellbeing indicators framework and data service, and its potential for providing information on community well-being to councils.
- the CREDS value-added production project (food, fibre and agritech), one of the key workstreams of the CREDS, and how councils can engage with the work



- endorsing a draft regional submission on the Zero Carbon Bill to the Environment Select Committee, for consideration and approval by the Mayoral Forum
- the CWMS and outcomes from the Fit for the Future project
- an update on the *train-the-trainers* workshop planned for August-September 2019 on writing recommendations that work and effective peer review
- updates from Canterbury Planning Managers, the Climate Change working group, the Compliance, Monitoring and Enforcement working group, and the Natural Hazards working group.
