The Canterbury Policy Forum met on 20 July 2018 and discussed:

- earthquake recovery, including progress on the Ministerial Review:
  Better Responses to Natural Disasters and Other Emergencies in
  New Zealand and the upcoming Canterbury Earthquake Symposium
  in November
- engagement with papatipu rūnanga through Tangata Whenua Advisory services, including presenting IT platforms and protocols developed by ECan to streamline how councils can engage with these entities in an open and transparent manner
- an update from Planning
  Managers and ECan on work to
  strengthen biodiversity across
  the Canterbury region. A report
  will go to the Mayoral Forum in
  November 2018.
- climate change, including recent developments in national policy, as well as national and regionallevel work on climate change adaptation
- shared training opportunities for councils to improve the quality of advice to decision makers
- hot topics for councils, including Three Waters, the recent LGNZ conference and lessons learned from Long-Term Plan processes
- updates from the Canterbury Planning Managers Group and the Compliance, Monitoring and Enforcement working group.
